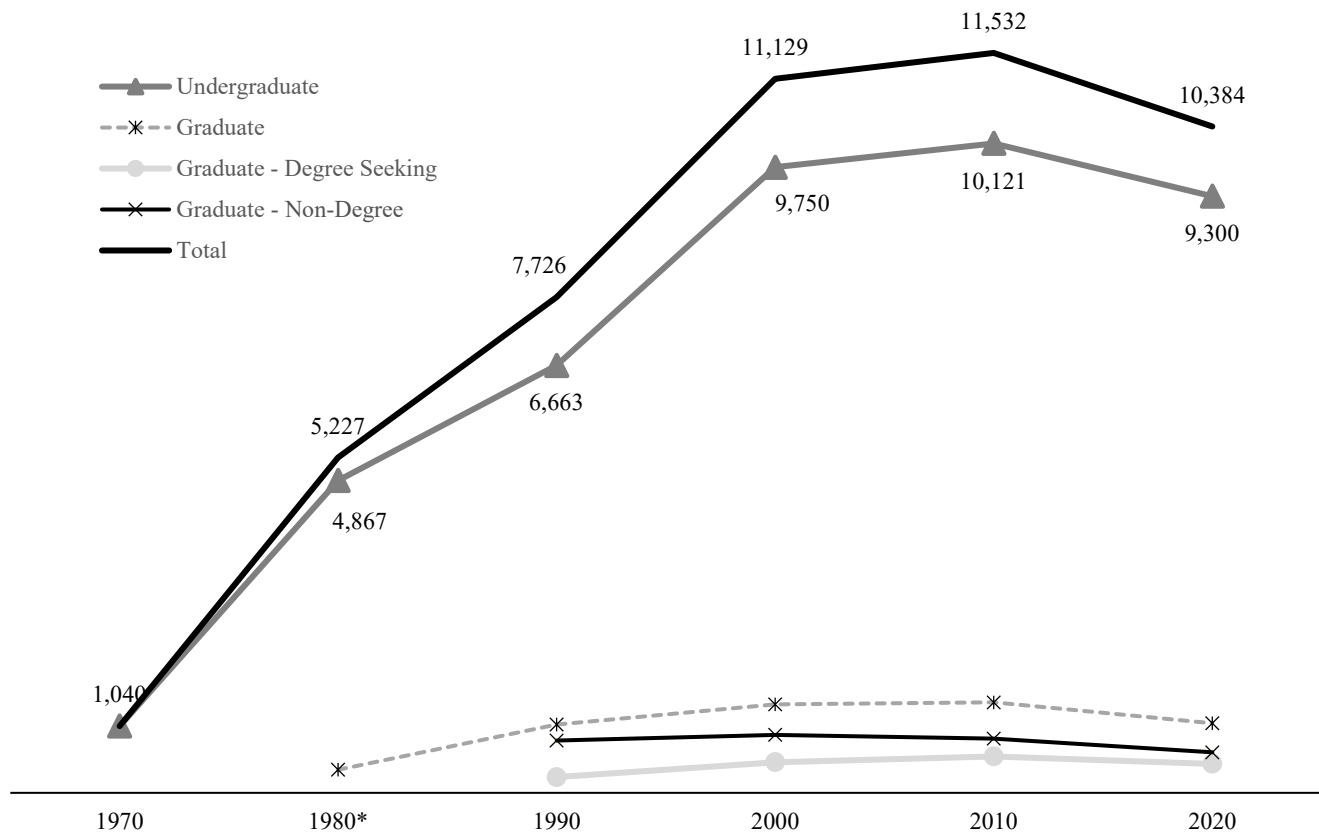

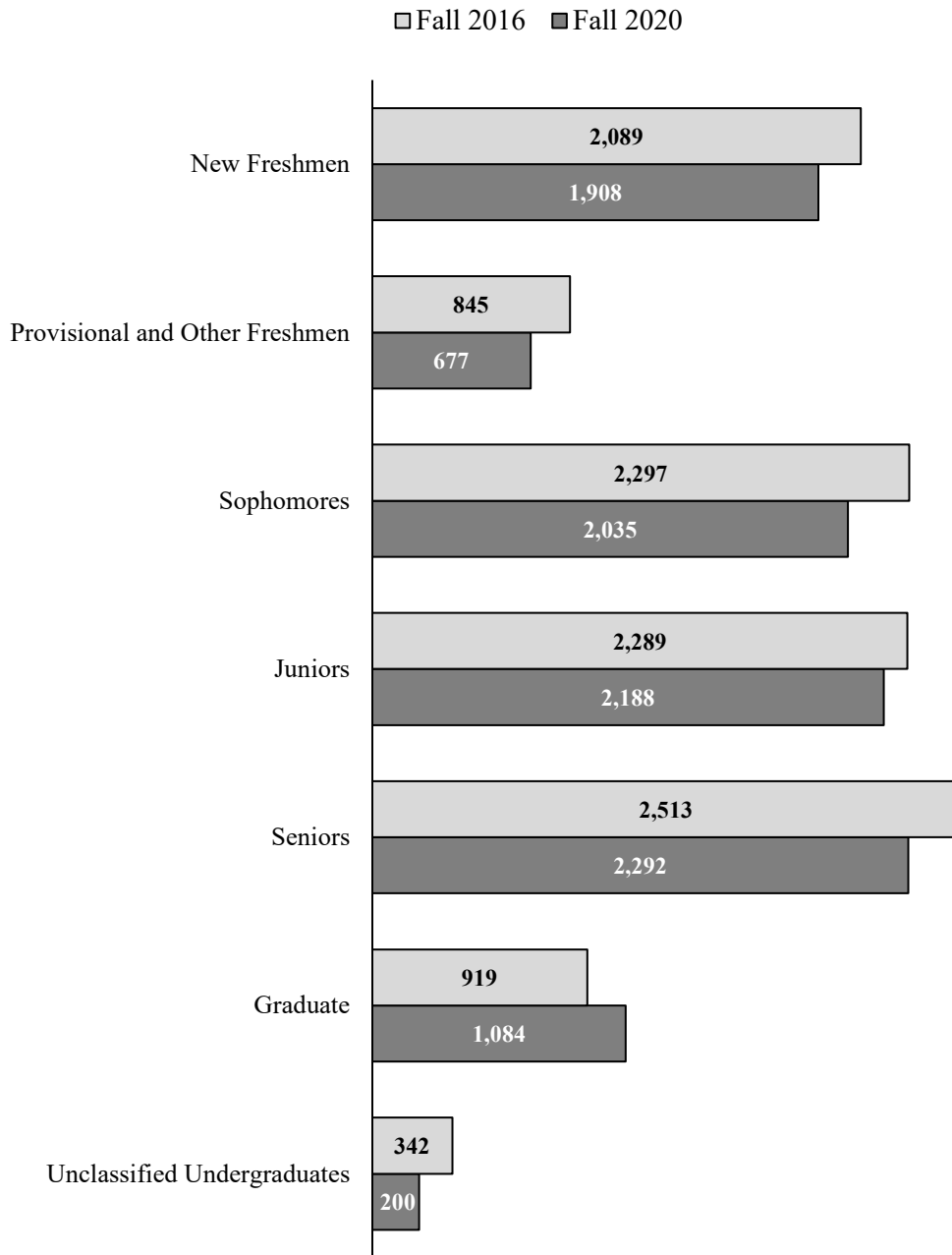

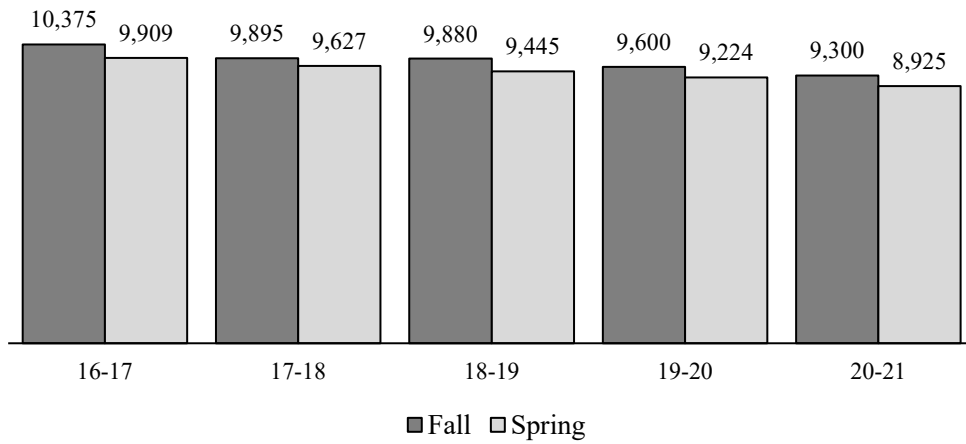

Student Headcounts by Class Comparison Fall 2016 and Fall 2020

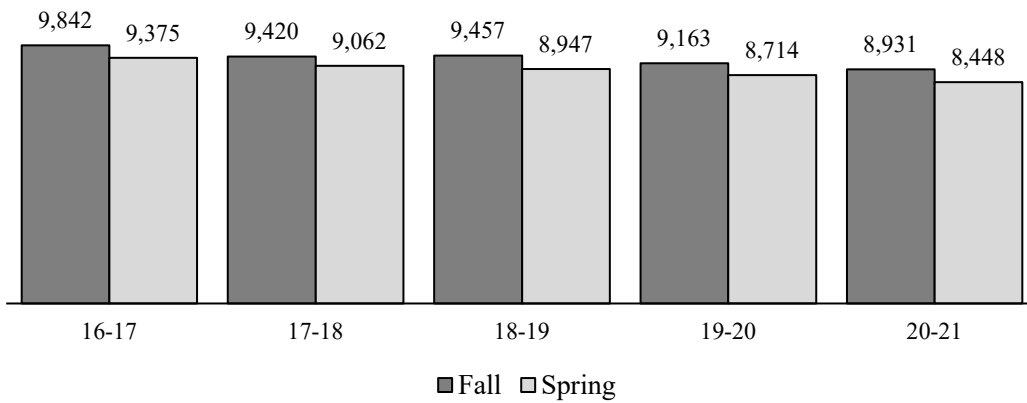


Undergraduate Student Headcount and FTE: Fall and Spring Semesters 2016-17 to 2020-21

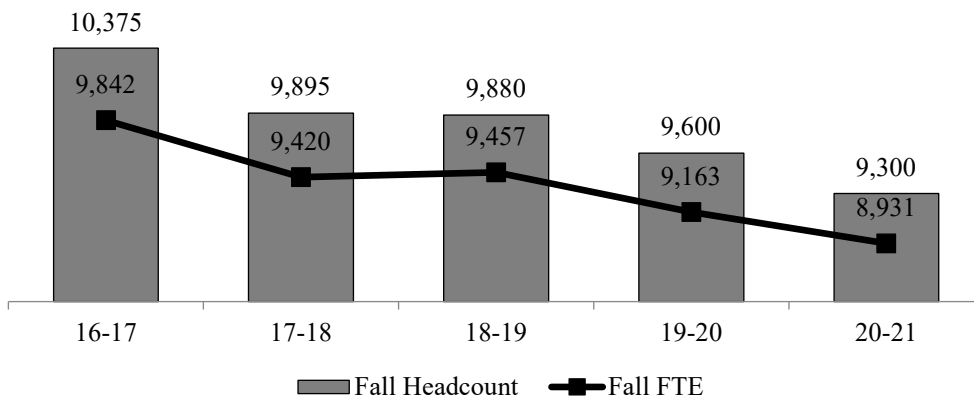

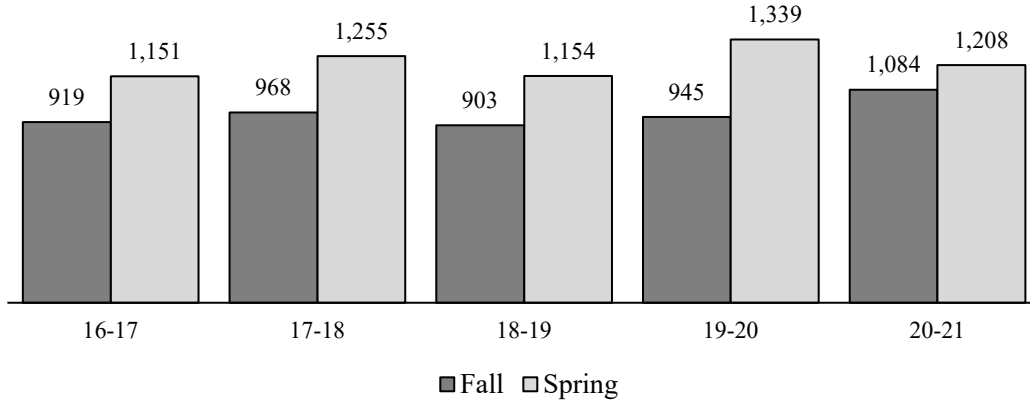

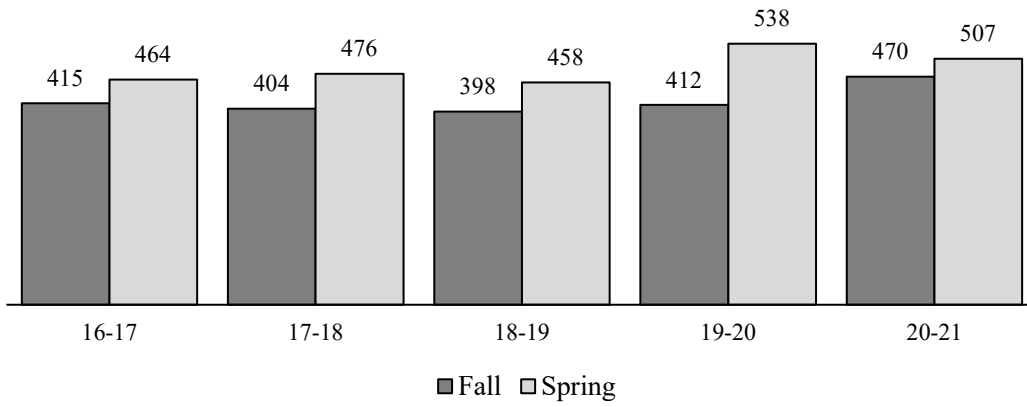


Graduate Student Headcount and FTE: Fall and Spring Semesters 2016-17 to 2020-21

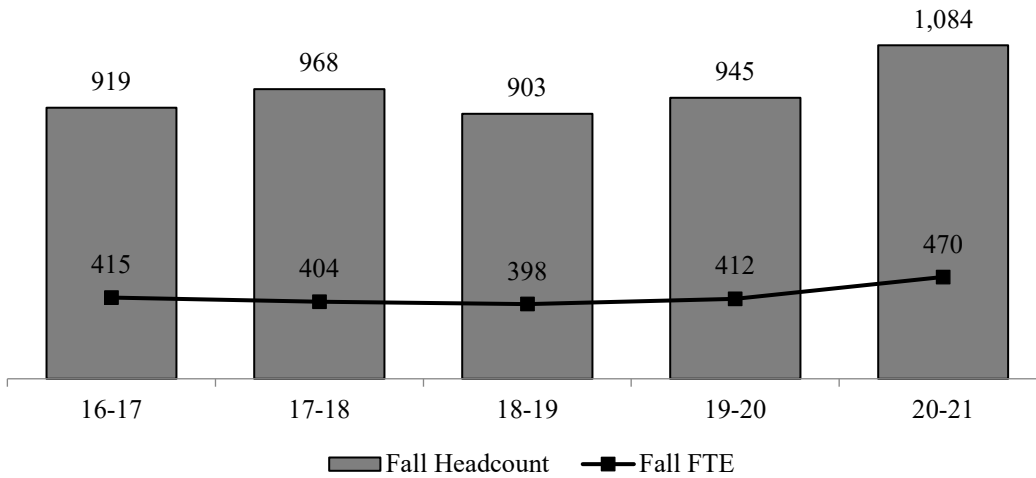

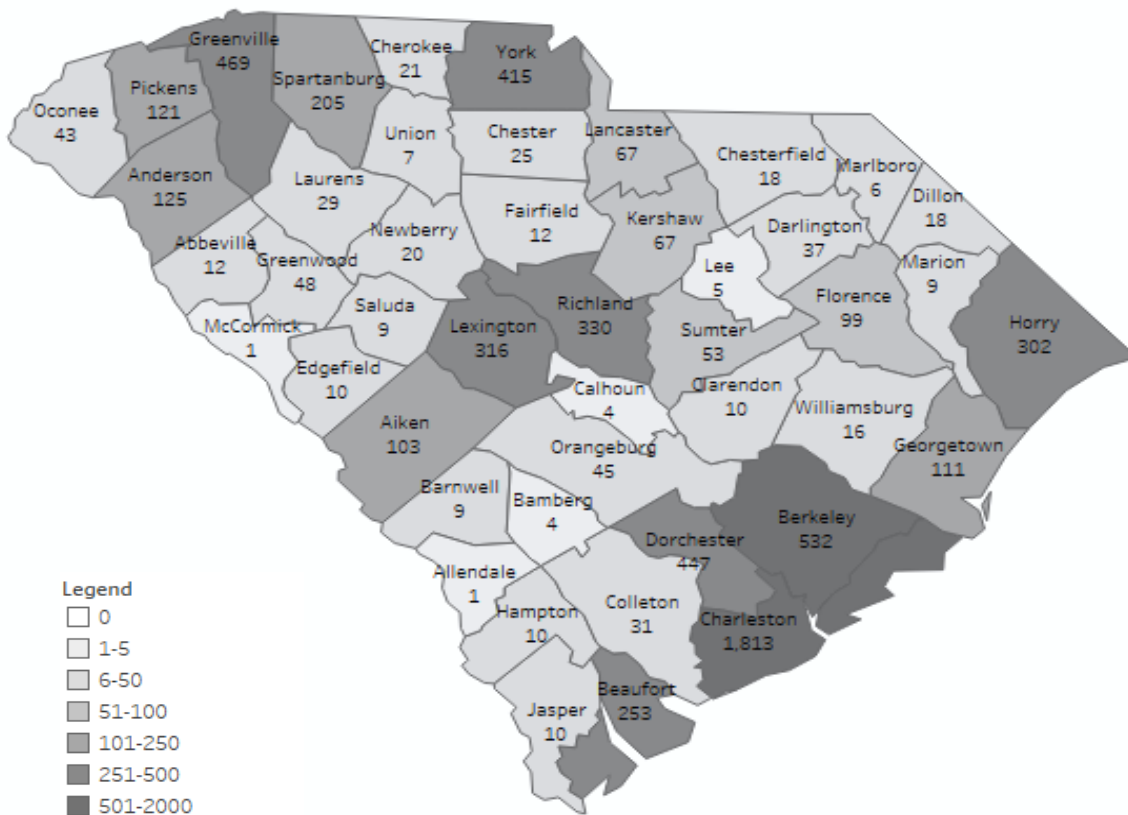

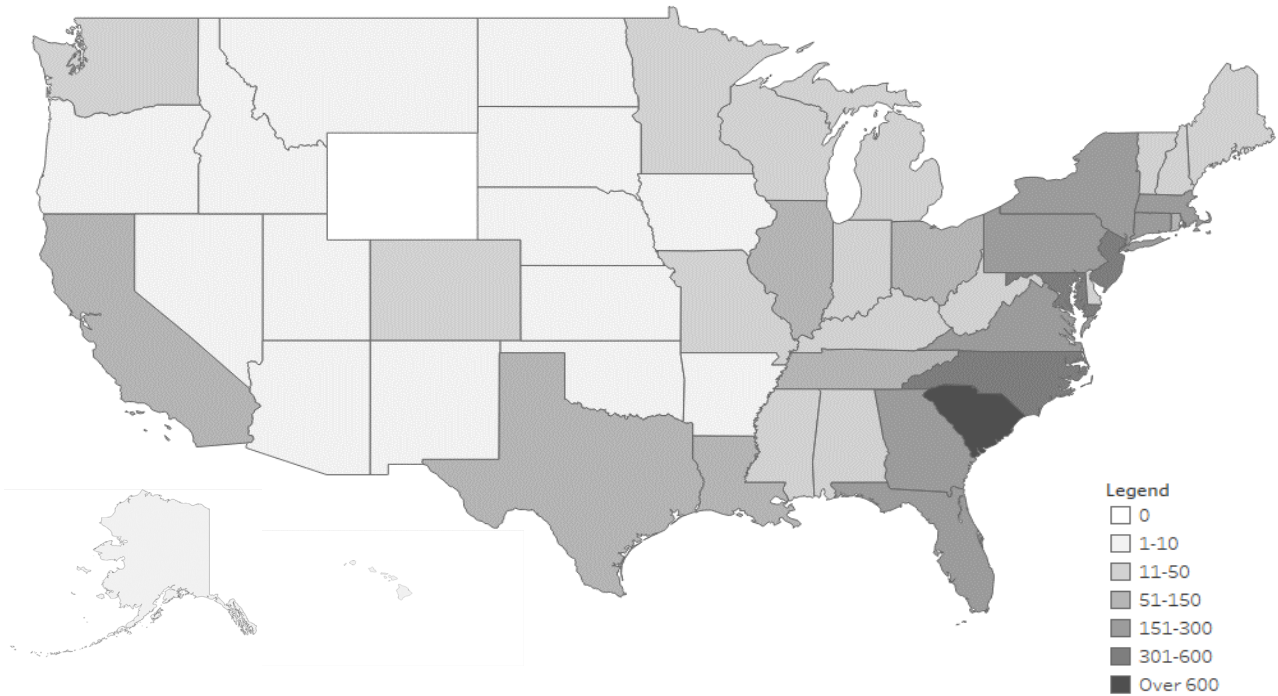

County of Origin of South Carolina Residents Fall 2020



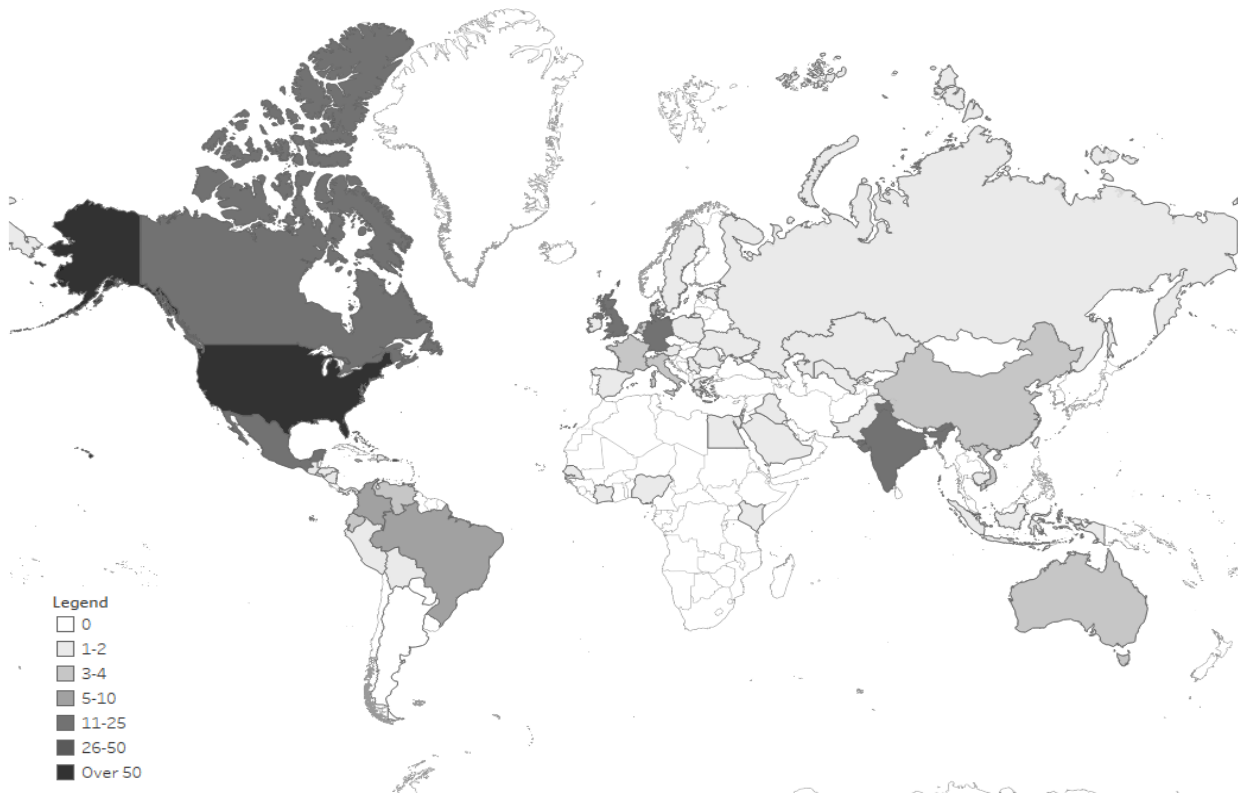

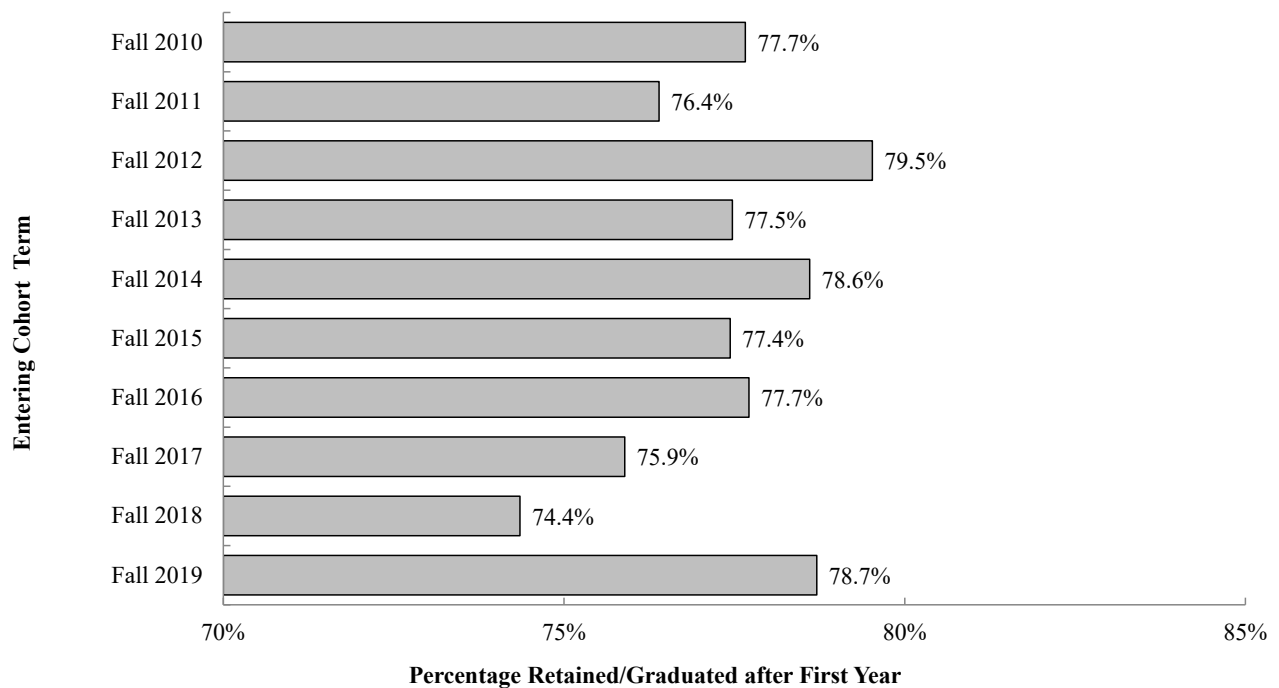

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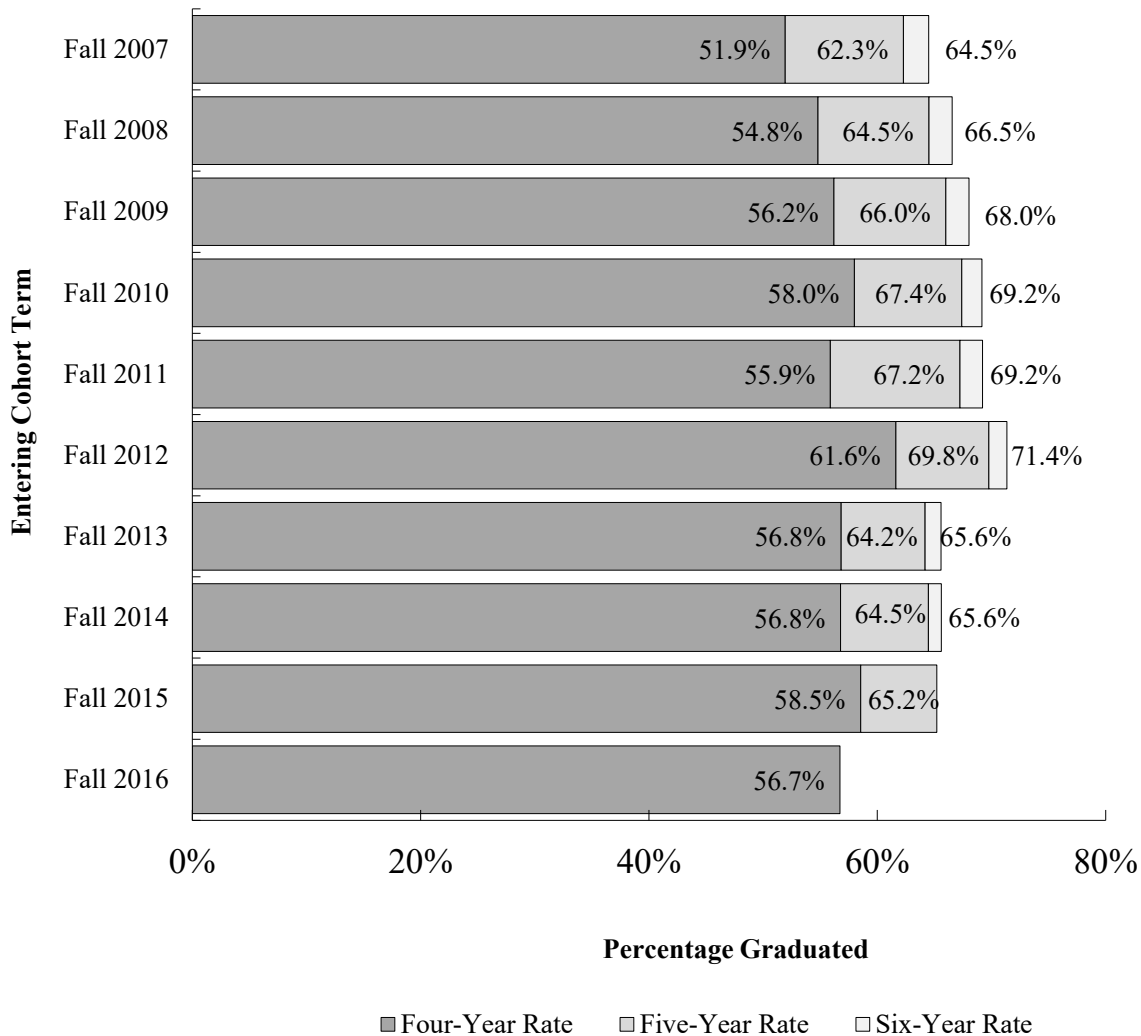
First-Year Retention Rates of All New, Full-Time Freshmen Cohort Year Fall 2010 to Cohort Year 2019

Graduation Rates of New Full-Time Freshmen by Race/Ethnicity Cohort Year 2009 to Cohort Year 2016

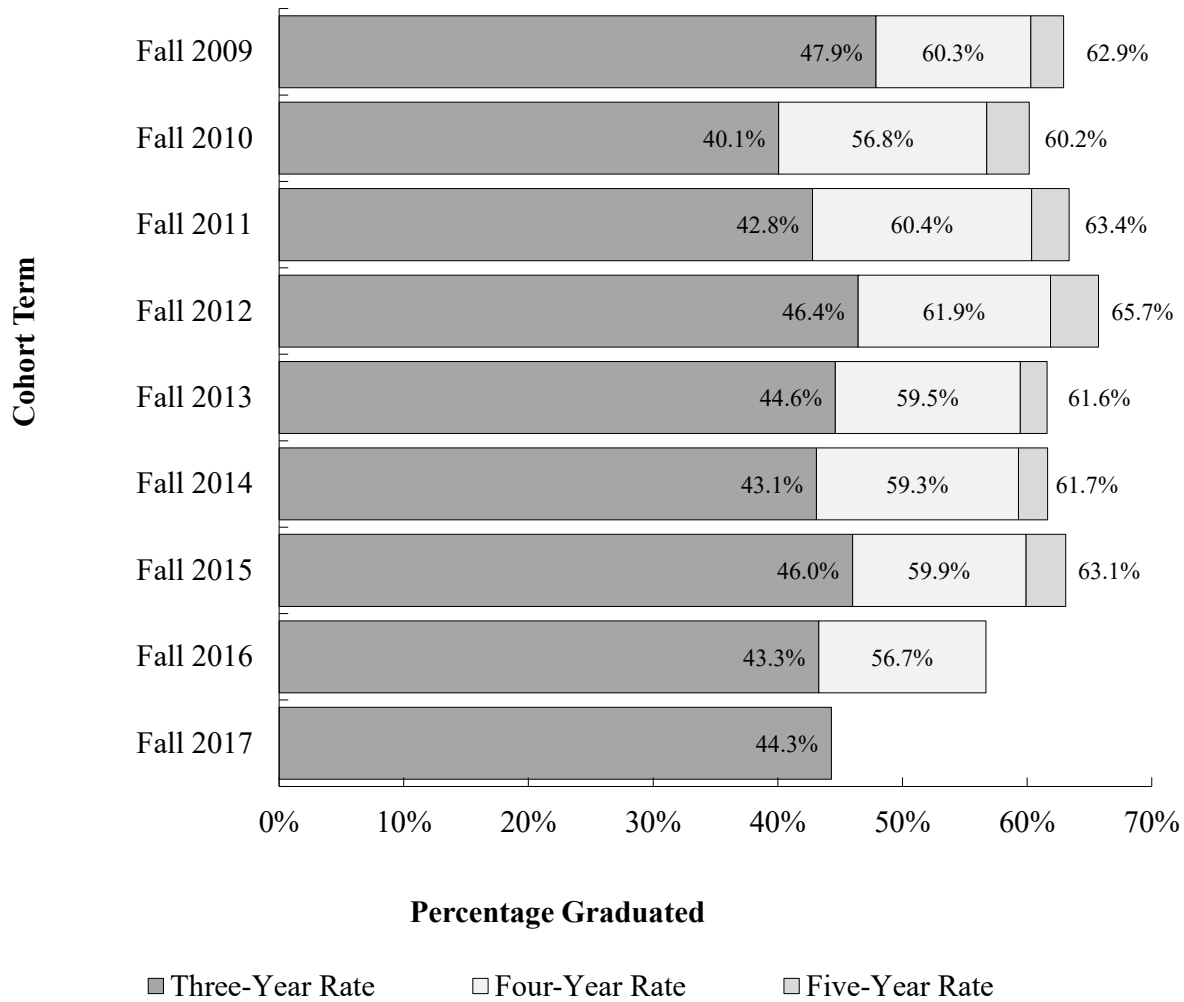

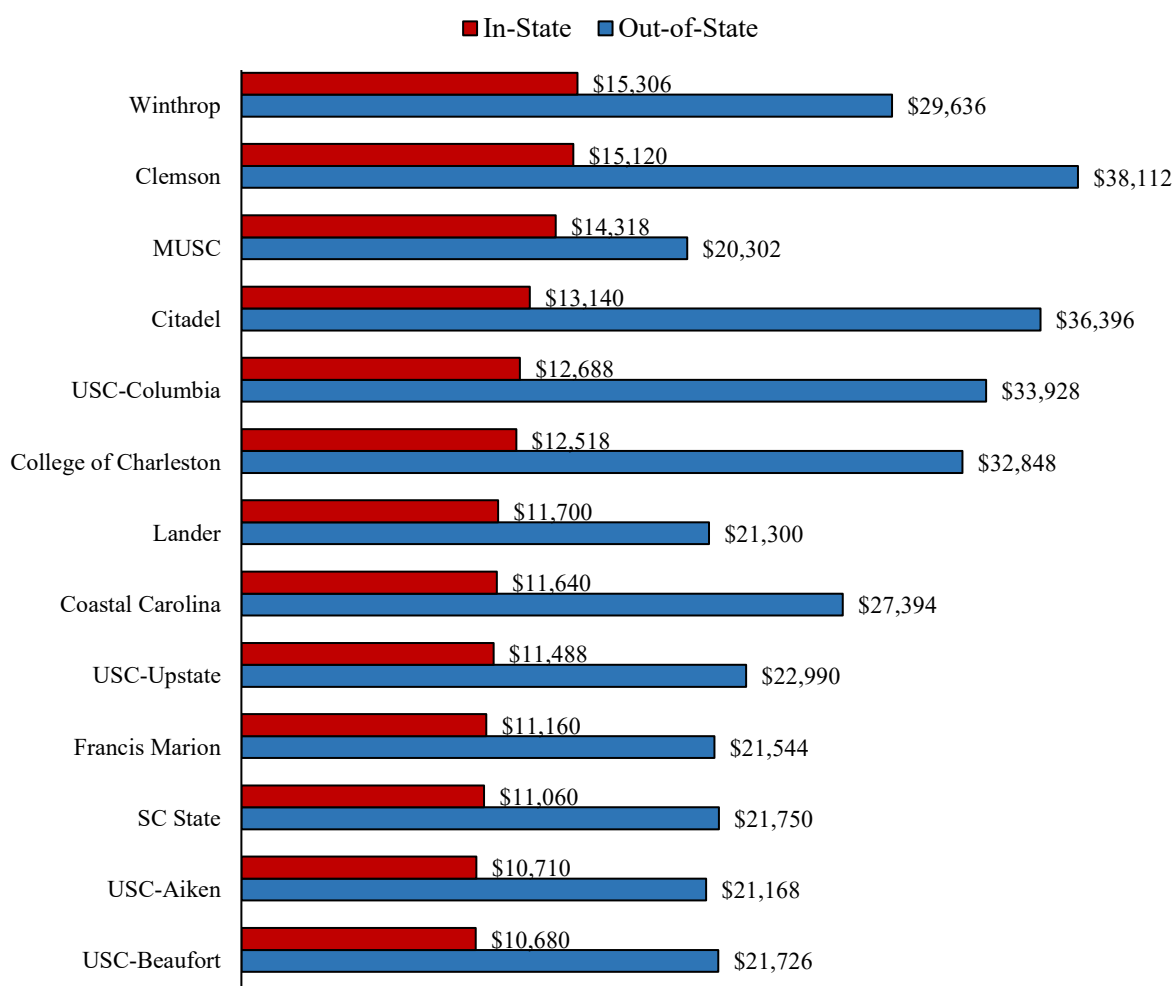
Graduation Rates of New Full-time Transfers Cohort Year 2009 to Cohort Year 2017

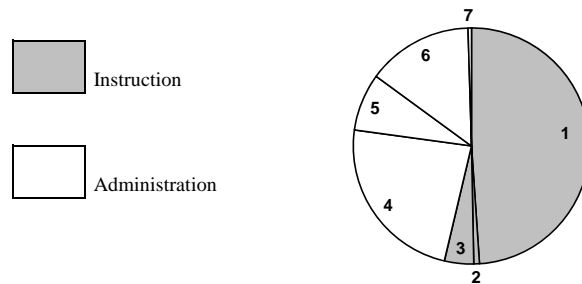

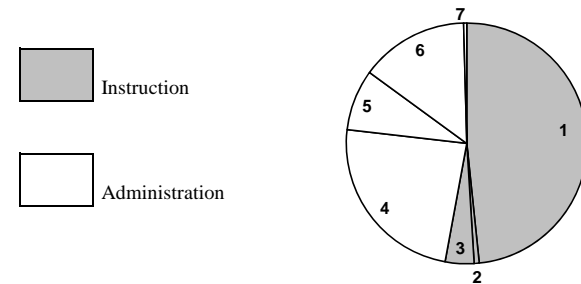
