

#### Local Government Leadership Institute


In 2021, the Riley Center, in conjunction with Francis Marion University and Coastal Carolina University, hosted its fifth year of the Local Government Leadership Institute in Lake City, SC. This program is designed to provide a skill-building educational experience for new and potential executive-level managers in South Carolina local governments. The program is intended to prepare participants to affect change in their organizations, and ultimately to improve the communities in which they live.

Twenty-five South Carolina local government employees graduated from the Local Government Leadership Institute in April 2021, and the sixth class began in October 2021. Participants cover topics like budgeting, planning, HR, managing effectively, and more.



#### **SPOTLIGHT:**

#### Together for Beaufort County



Together for Beaufort County is a consortium of groups that aim to address specific societal needs in their community. It represents the community's commitment to collaborative work to achieve positive collective impact.

The Riley Center worked with Together for Beaufort County to produce a report that examined the social well-being, health, education, environment, and economy of Beaufort County. The purpose was to find the areas in which the community is doing well, and the areas that are in the most need of improvements to be addressed by the group. The report was designed to be easy to read and accessible to everyone.

The report was presented to the group in June 2021 and is currently being used to address problem areas in Beaufort County. In 2022, the Riley Center is working to produce a report specifically focused on education in the county.

## HIGHLIGHTS



The Riley hosted the third year of the Riley Mayors' Design Fellowship in June 2021.
This program is in partnership with Clemson University, the Municipal Association of SC, and the SC Arts Commission. We pair SC Mayors with Clemson graduate students and experts in fields such as landscape architecture and downtown revitalization in order to address an issue or a proposed project in their town or city.

Fall of 2021, The Riley Center helped to design and conduct a statewide employee engagement survey for the South Carolina Department of Mental Health.

The Riley Center oversaw the development of the strategic plans for the Isle of Palms and Dorchester County's Public Safety division.

In January of 2021, The Riley Center oversaw the largest South Carolina City and County Management Association (SCCCMA) event yet!

SCCCMA is comprised of 180 city and county managers, administrators, and assistants throughout the state. The group meets twice a year for professional development sessions, ample networking, swapping best practices, and more.

The Community Foundation of the Lowcountry worked with the Riley Center and the Master of Public Administration Community Assistance Program (CAP) to develop a *Vital Signs*® Report for the Foundation's four-county service area.

Both nationally and internationally, these reports help to measure the vitality of local communities and support actions toward improving a collective quality of life.
